School Leaders Voting Policy - 2017

RATIONALE

School life provides many opportunities for young people to develop leadership and representation skills. Formal student leadership and student representation programs provide important benefits for individual students and schools. Student leaders have the potential to influence the school environment and the behaviour of their fellow students by becoming advocates for positive change in the school community.

Our school recognises the importance of students having a say in the decision making process at school. To allow students an input in the decision making process we vote for a school leadership team. This team consists School and House leaders and elected students from the student body to represent their class at student Council meetings.

GUIDELINES

At Alpha State School, students have a variety of ways to become leaders within the school setting. The school encourages these leadership roles to be spread amongst the student body. In 2016, students may nominate for more than one position, however can only take up one of the leadership roles within the year. There will be no School Captains in 2016 due to their being no Year 10 students enrolled.


POSITION DESCRIPTION

Student leaders at Alpha P - 10 State School are the student representatives of our learning community. This representation is a public position with student leaders being called upon on official/ special occasions (at the discretion of the Principal) to embrace and model all values and expectations of students within our community. In addition to this students leaders will

- ✓ Be responsible to the school administration and should carry out all duties asked of them by any member of the school administration
- ✓ Promote all goals and values that are important at Alpha P–10 State School
- ✓ Display exemplary conduct and attitudes relating to all areas of school life
- ✓ Work enthusiastically with fellow students in assisting the educational opportunities for all



Positions include:



A maximum of 8 students will represent the student body.

POSITION DESCRIPTORS

School Captains/ Prefects

- ✓ Commit to and model all of the 4 Alpha State School Values Learning, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility
- ✓ Demonstrate consistent high attendance
- ✓ To work closely with school administration in positively promoting the school and its activities to the broader community
- ✓ Assist in the co-coordination of special events held by the learning community.
- ✓ To act as a point of liaison between School Administration and the Student Body ensuring concerns, ideas and visions are communicated

House Captains

- ✓ Commit to and model all of the 4 Alpha State School Values Learning, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility
- ✓ Demonstrate consistent high attendance

- ✓ Assist the Health and Physical Education Teacher in the organization of the annual Athletics carnival and swimming carnivals and any other sporting activities that the HPE teacher deems necessary
- ✓ Assist teachers in conducting training sessions during lunchtime in order to prepare students from your house for the School's Athletics carnival.
- ✓ Motivate all students to engage in all competitive/special activities with pride and determination
- ✓ To lead your School House in full voice when reciting your war cry

Student Council Members

- ✓ Commit to and model all of the 4 Alpha State School Values Learning, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility
- ✓ Demonstrate consistent high attendance
- ✓ Act as mentor to younger students
- ✓ To make visitors to our school feel welcome and show them around
- ✓ To be a buddy to younger students who are in need of a friend

CANCELLATION OF APPOINTMENT

The Principal may request a meeting with a student who holds a position of student leadership and ask for them to show cause as to why their appointment should not be cancelled. The Principal may call a meeting of this nature when the Student leader is not following the values and expectations of Alpha State School. When it is determined by the Principal that the Student Leader is not sufficiently modifying their actions to maintain their position of leadership, the Principal will cancel the appointment and call for new candidates to fulfil that role or the position will remain vacant, as at the Principal's discretion.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP QUALITITES

Student Leaders must be automated in displaying the following qualities:

Positive Attitude towards others

- ✓ Look like you enjoy life
- ✓ Greet others
- ✓ See the good in others
- ✓ Be helpful and thoughtful
- ✓ Treat others as well as you would like to be treated

Demonstrate School Pride and Spirit

- ✓ Wear uniform appropriately
- ✓ Keep yourself neat and tidy
- ✓ Demonstrating a high standard of behaviour while wearing the uniform or involved in school activities

Appreciation, understanding and commitment regarding school rules

- ✓ Safety rules e.g. running, boundaries
- ✓ Hat wearing
- ✓ Pick up rubbish, putting things away, returning things

Self-Motivation and Reliability - 'go the extra mile', self-organise and follow through

- ✓ Do what you say you will
- ✓ See situations and act
- ✓ Get going yourself without needing others to chase you up or tell you
- ✓ Do set tasks without reminders

Use courtesy, consideration, trustworthiness and acceptance of others

- ✓ Use good manners
- ✓ Think about the other persons viewpoint
- ✓ Be honest
- ✓ Accept others for their difference cultural, religious, disabilities or skills

Attendance

- ✓ Attend school regularly
- ✓ Help out with school fund-raising activities
- ✓ Participating in Leadership Camp

High Standard in work, effort and behaviour and encourage others

- ✓ Use maximum effort in own work
- ✓ Model good behaviour in the playground
- ✓ Model good behaviour in class
- ✓ Notice when others do well and compliment them
- ✓ Notice when others try hard and encourage them

Positive community relationships

- ✓ When in school uniform be on best behaviour.
- ✓ Don't degrade the school with comments or thoughtlessness
- ✓ Spread the word about the good aspects of our school

Public presentation

- ✓ Being able to make announcements on parade
- ✓ Participating in school ceremonies by giving talks, votes of thanks, readings and speeches

SELECTION PROCESS

Pre Selection

Students will be informed of the criteria for pre selection prior to nominating for a position of office. This will generally relate to behaviour during the previous school year/ years. A separate criteria sheet for preselection will be used. Only students who meet the pre selection criteria, can then nominate for a leadership position.

Stage One

Students write a letter or email to The Principal indicating which position they are applying for and a brief reason why they would be suitable for this position. Students must have considered their suitability for the position they are nominating for. E.g. Positive behaviour record, leadership qualities, sportsmanship. Students must have discussed their desire to apply for a leadership position with a parent/caregiver as the student leader may be required to attend events outside of school hours. E.g. ANZAC day parades.

Stage Two

Students who wish to be considered for Prefect and/or House Captain will prepare and deliver a speech to the student body in years 4–10 on why they wish to be considered for a position of student leadership, and how they would contribute to the well-being of our learning community.

Stage Three

Students in Years 4-10 will vote for positions of Prefect and House Captain. Staff members will also cast a vote for Prefect and House Captain Positions.

Stage Four

Candidates will then be considered according to the following process. See attached matrix.

- 1. Number of Student Votes (Raw score)
- 2. Number of Staff Votes (Raw Score)
- 3. Speech

Stage Five

The School Principal will then contact and appoint the highest ranked candidates for each of the positions. In the event a student refuses the position then the Principal will then go to the next highest ranked candidate and offer the same until acceptance is gained. Notification of appointment of School Leader positions will be published in the newsletter/website (in accordance with Student Media Release restrictions) In Term 4 of 2016, the Leadership Procedures and Voting for 2017 will be conducted and announced at Speech Night.

		Students expressing interest in nominating for a leadership position, including a reason why they should be considered, are required to notify the Principal by email or letter. (Appendix D)Students do not have to detail their entire leadership speech.

4	7	Speeches: 17 November				
		 After assembly, the Year 4–10 students will remain in the hall 				
		for Leadership speeches. Each nominated candidate will then deliver a brief speech outlining why they should be voted a school leader.				
4	7	Polling Day: 17 November				
		 After candidates have delivered their speeches students vote. 				
		 Voting will take place by secret ballot. 				
		 Each student voting will be marked off a class list. 				

		 Prefects are voted by the whole student body. House captains – students from the house teams only vote for their captain. Counting of Votes: The Principal and Administration Staff will count all votes. All ballot papers will be retained by the Principal.
4	7	 Student Council Representatives: 1 representative from Upper Primary Years 4 - 6 1 representative from the Senior School Years 7-10 Nominations: The class teacher will ask for nominations from the students. Names are written on the board. Students will vote by secret ballot. Votes are counted by class teacher and announced to the class. The class teacher will notify the Principal of Student Council representative/s.
